Dear Friends in Christ,

A colleague of mine once told me the story about a season in his ministry when he was between churches. One of his friends said to him, "When you need a place to sing your songs and you need a place to pray your prayers, my church is always open to you." That invitation has stuck in his heart and mind because the truth is that he *did* need a place to sing his songs and pray his prayers. He *did* need a church.

I will admit that there have been times in my life when I didn't realize how deeply I needed a place to sing and pray. Still, I was fortunate to have had someone, in fact my own mother, invite me to come with her to church at a moment when my heart was ready to be broken open by a community dedicated to worshipping Christ. Coming back to church with her taught me that I, too, needed a place to sing my songs and pray my prayers.

Now I find that most weeks, Sunday feels very much like the most important day to me. It's the day I get to spend time with my church family, singing and praying and worshipping our God. It's a time to be together, to be refreshed and to be reminded of who we are and whose we are. It gives us the strength and courage and the guidance to go into another week, ready to love our God and our neighbors; ready to serve Christ and one another.

Being invited to church while he was without a faith community changed my colleague's life. Being invited to church during an important moment in my life changed my own. I wonder, whose life could you change by inviting them to church? Who do you know who needs a place to sing their songs and pray their prayers?

I hope that you will take some time to think and pray about what church, and what this church, means to you. How has this church fed your spirit? How has your congregation changed your life? How does worshipping together every Sunday prepare you for the week that lies ahead?

And then tell someone about your church, about how special and life-giving it is to you. Invite them to join you one Sunday, because maybe it will change their life, too.

I'll see you on Sunday!

May is Melanoma Month

AiM at Melanoma was founded in 2004. It is the largest international melanoma foundation seeking the cure. Aim provides comprehensive, easy to access information and resources to patients, caregivers, family members, and health care professionals, from prevention to diagnosis, to treatment, and beyond. Primary melanoma tissue banks are needed to accelerate development of new treatments.

Melanie Benz, whose mother is a neighbor of Rosedale, passed away in February. She was a nurse anesthetist with a 2 year-old son. Her mother is hoping to save lives as Melanie saved lives. She is trying to raise money for the desperately needed tissue banks, but <u>mostly</u> she wants to spread awareness about melanoma.

Melanoma is the fastest growing cancer around the world. The rate of pediatric melanoma tripled in the last ten years. It is the 2nd most common type of cancer for men and 3rd for women ages 20-39. Melanoma takes the life of one person every hour.

Treat Mom with this yummy, beautiful yogurt parfait.




What you need:
